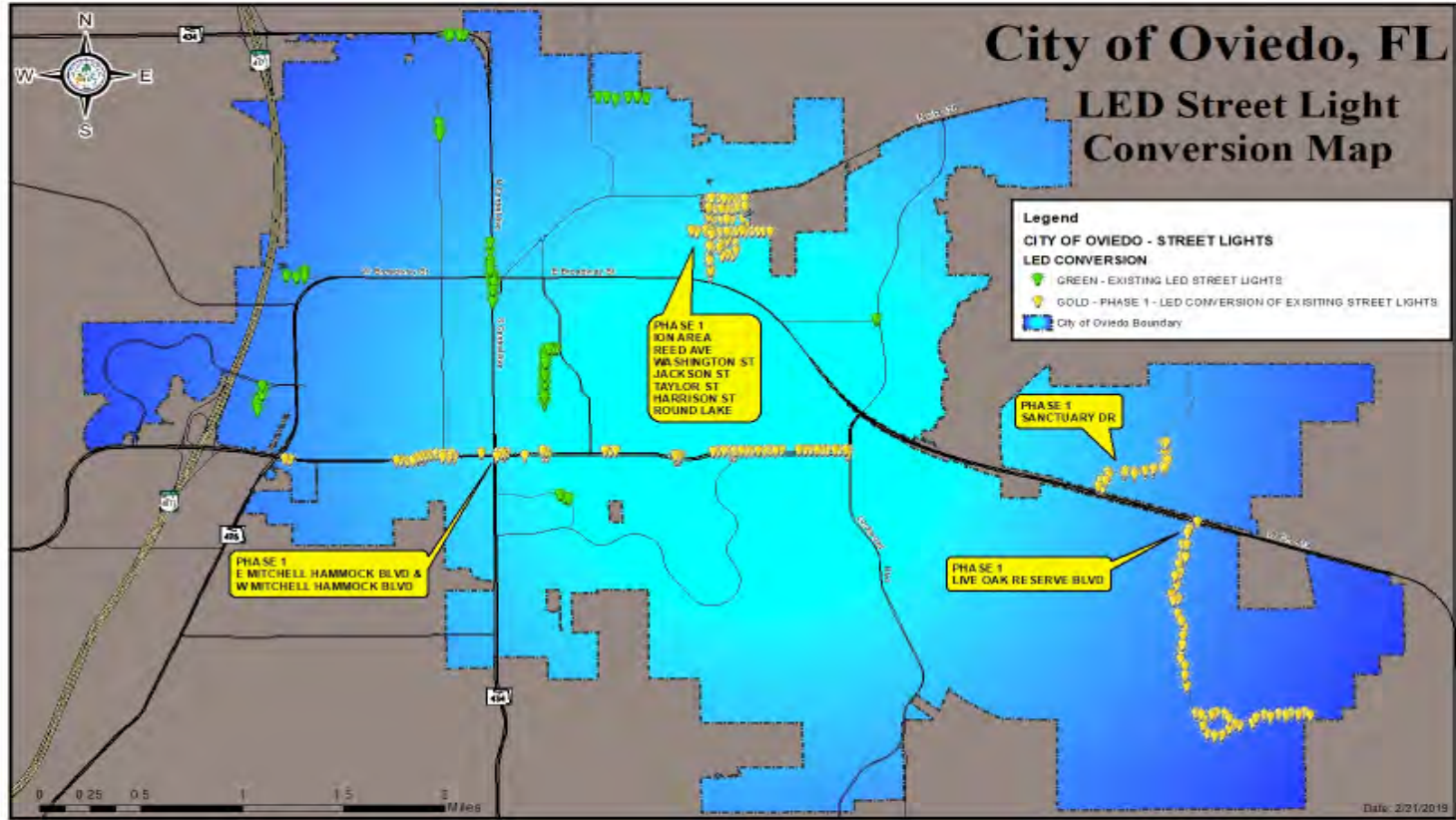

- ◆ Adopted Resolution No. 3478-17 – PACE Program
- ◆ Adopted Resolution No. 3601-18 setting the goal for 100% use of renewable energy for all City operations by 2050
- ◆ Adopted Resolution No. 3697-19 – Supporting Seminole County's Solar Co-op

Duke Energy Park and Plug Pilot Program

- ◆ City of Oviedo selected to receive electric vehicle charging stations at 2 sites
 - ◆ City Hall
 - ◆ Oviedo on the Park
- ◆ Advances the City's sustainability efforts



Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

- ◆ Oviedo LDC Code encourages construction of environmentally-friendly building design
- ◆ Electric car charging stations required for commercial development offering more than 50 parking spaces: 1 charging station serving 2 parking spaces

Round Lake Park Improvements (Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant)

- ◆ Three (3) new tennis courts with pickle ball lines/sports lighting
- ◆ Renovation of two (2) existing tennis courts
- ◆ New picnic pavilion
- ◆ Basketball court renovation
 - ◆ South court shade structure and LED lighting
- ◆ Fishing pier renovation
- ◆ LED sports lighting retrofit of existing lighting
- ◆ Landscaping
- ◆ Hiking trail



Oviedo Sports Complex Improvements (Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program Grant)

- ◆ Field improvements to baseball field D1 and softball field 3
- ◆ Playground renovation – shade structure and PIP safety surface
- ◆ Multi-use trail – concrete trail from playground connecting to the softball east side of the park
- ◆ Picnic pavilion renovation
- ◆ Parking facility renovation – new Crimson Stone area
- ◆ Landscaping (in house)

Seminole County is Bear Country

- ◆ City is working with Seminole County and Florida Fish and Wildlife to add portions of Eastern Seminole County, including portions of the City of Oviedo, to the Urban Bear Management Area
- ◆ Florida Fish and Wildlife is evaluating data to best locate the boundaries of the Urban Bear Management Area



Urban Bear Management Area Ordinance Quick Facts

- ◆ What would this Ordinance require?
 - ◆ Refuse to be secured at all times except those days that refuse is picked up by trash haulers
 - ◆ Refuse to be secured in a trashcan and not be moved from the secure area to the curb for pick-up until 5am (or after) on scheduled garbage pick-up dates
 - ◆ Once emptied, trash containers be moved back to the secure location as soon as possible (ideally, by 8pm)
 - ◆ Other bear attractants be secured: bird feeders, pet food, unclean grills, fruit trees, and other food items

Urban Bear Management Area Ordinance Quick Facts

- ◆ Will I be required to purchase a bear resistant container?
 - ◆ No, the Ordinance does not require residents to purchase a bear resistant container
 - ◆ However, residents will be prohibited from setting their can out before 5:00 a.m. on their collection day unless they utilize a bear resistant container

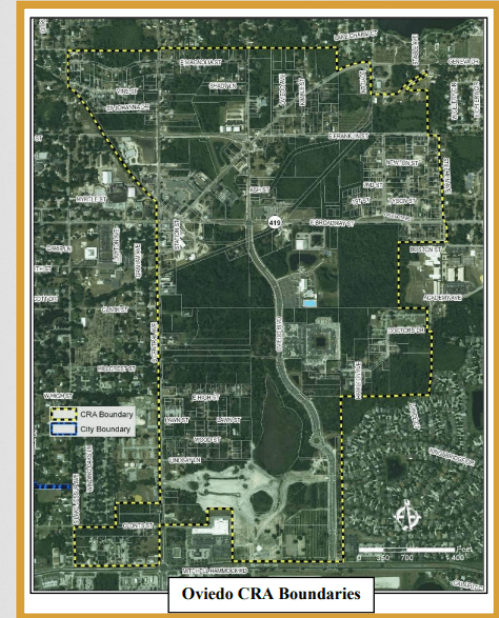

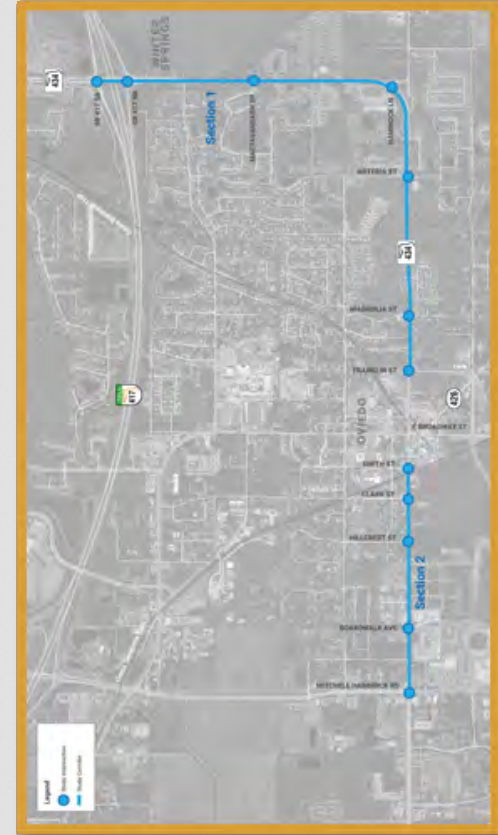
Community Redevelopment Agency Projects

- ◆ Wood Street Extension to Windy Pine Way
- ◆ Community Center Rehabilitation
- ◆ Downtown Trailhead - connectivity
- ◆ Facade Grants
- ◆ Public Arts Program Support

- ◆ Streetscaping



SR 434 Corridor Study

- ◆ Two phase project
 - ◆ 434 north from Franklin St. to SR 417
 - ◆ Smith St. to Mitchell Hammock Rd.
- ◆ Study completion anticipated second quarter 2019



SR 426 / CR 419 Phase 2 (Aerial Upon Completion)

- ◆ 39 of 59 parcels (including easements) acquired for the right-of-way
- ◆ Construction to begin once right-of-way acquisition is complete

Downtown Stormwater Park Concept

- ◆ Regional Stormwater Pond/Park at 90% design, construction anticipated late 2019
- ◆ Site will include walking path and boardwalk circling the pond, and a restroom building
- ◆ Anticipating St. Johns River Water Management District and State of Florida Dept. of Environmental Protection grant funding



Police Department Headquarters

- ◆ Review of space needs analysis completed
- ◆ Master Planning concepts and layout completed
- ◆ Development of scope and fee for design, bid, and construction administrative services completed
- ◆ Next step - City Council approval to proceed to the design phase

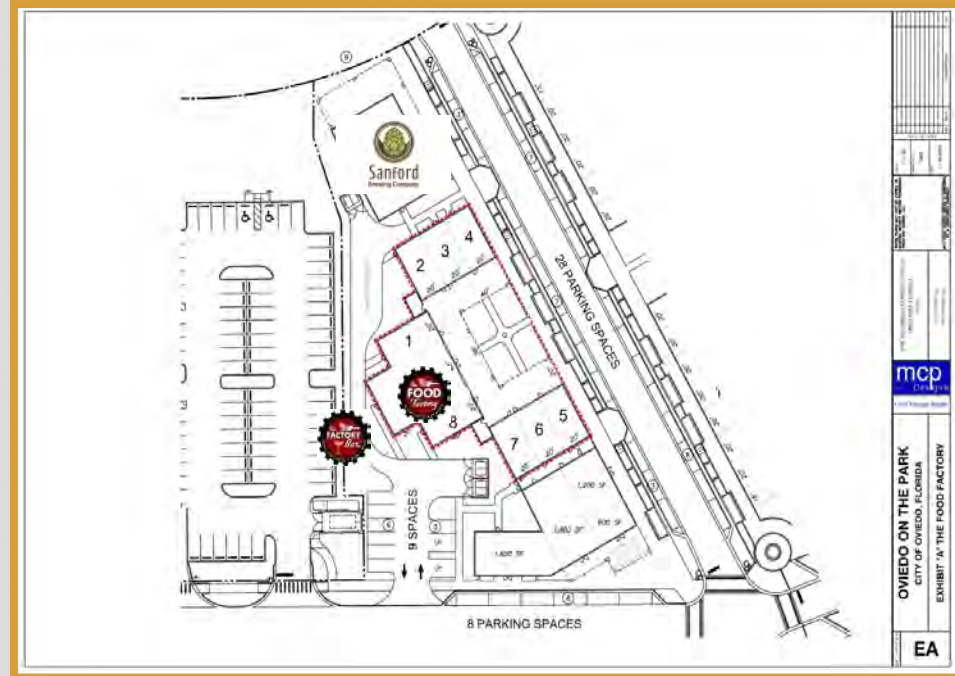
